



#### BANK HOLIDAY MAGIC AT MOTTISFONT

Mottisfont Abbey is not always wrapped up in scaffolding and corrugated iron. Regular visitors will know that the Abbey is a beautiful building, providing the perfect centrepiece for these gardens. Both the National Trust and the Maskers Theatre make good use of the Abbey as a backdrop for their annual plays and musical entertainments.

In this the National Trust's Centenary year, Mottisfont Abbey is undergoing major renovations. When it re-opens at the start of the 1966 visitors season, there will be a long awaited tea-shop, more show-rooms, an exhibition and a conference suite inside.

The scaffolding is due to come down at the end of August, and the National Trust is celebrating with a brand new event called THE MOTTISFONT REVELS.

From Friday 25 - Sunday 27 August, the moonlit house and garden will provide the setting for three nights of family entertainment on a magical theme. Magicians, illusionists, dancers and acrobats will perform around the garden amid sculpture, lighting and decorations. There will even be stunt kites and a hot air balloon. This is a chance to put on fancy dress, bring a picnic and a rug and see Mottisfont as never before. Each evening will be rounded off with a firework finale to fabulous percussion music by top player Alisdair Malloy. It promises to be a breathtaking event.

The Mottisfont Revels will, we hope, become an annual event, raising money for restoration projects such as the current one. Tickets are £13.00 for adults and £5.00 for children. 
