

Director's Notes - Yards Apart

The journey of putting **Yards Apart** on stage has been far longer and more winding than I ever could have imagined. Little did I know back in the summer of 2019, when I asked (pretty please!) if I could write a play for Maskers, that it would be two long years before it actually happened.

When I began writing the big news was Brexit - no-one had ever heard of Coronavirus and the idea of England being in a major football final was still a fantasy. It seems like an age ago that I gave so much screen scrolling time to the furore over our departure from the EU. But it was the divide between leavers and remainers that planted the seed for this story that explores the nature of 'division'. You'll be pleased to hear that this is not a play about Brexit – phew! That was simply the inspiration. What I hope to achieve with **Yards Apart** is to look at how and why we create barriers and, more importantly, what we can do to overcome differences and find connections. And considering the fallout following the Euros - and the public attitude about our players - it seems that themes relating to nationality and belonging are as relevant now as they were two years ago.

I want to thank Maskers for giving **Yards Apart** the green light, especially when it was based on a first draft that almost completely transformed during rewrites. The support is much appreciated! Thanks also to my cast and crew for their commitment, positivity and patience as we've arranged and rearranged performance dates. And I must give a special mention to Hazel Slawson for reading drafts, giving me feedback and encouraging me to keep going. So, at last, we made it. And after many delays the world premiere of Yards Apart has finally arrived!

Written and Directed by Mary Stone - Mary is delighted to be presenting her one-act play, Yards Apart, for its world première at Maskers. It will be the fifth show she has directed, following: Lemons, Lemons, Lemons, Lemons, Lemons (2019), God of Carnage (2016) Colder Than Here (2013) and the NODA award winning Last Train to Nibroc (2011). Mary has also directed for The Chesil Theatre's 10x10 festival, produced several shows and worked backstage in a number of roles from Stage Manager to Lighting Operator. Mary used to tread the boards too, and had roles in Entertaining Angels, Kindertransport, Blood Wedding, An Inspector Calls and Habeas Corpus all at The Chesil Theatre. Mary has also written comedy sketches, short plays, a short film and has had a short story published in an online anthology of horror stories!

Yards Apart will be followed by a twenty minute interval during which we will change the set ready for Sharks in the Custard.

Debuting with Maskers in *Wyrd Sisters* as part of the ensemble in 2018, Anna has contributed backstage and helped with marketing in 2019 before returning to the Maskers' stage for *100* to play Nina in October. She has had her first experience of Masker's summer open-air production, playing *Beatrice* in *Much Ado About Nothing*. Anna has been involved with local dramatic groups since 2014 and started off exclusively in costume. The acting bug grabbed her in 2016 when she performed in *A Midsummer Night's Dream* as Snout the Tinker with the Curdridge Players. She has also performed with SUP in *And Then There Were None*, contributed to their war memorial performances of *For the Fallen* and played Mother in *The Railway Children*.

Anna is over the moon to be cast in *Yards Apart* as it's an exciting new production and gives her the opportunity to explore and build on the character of Viki with Mary and Philip, as well as exploring themes about perceptions, beliefs and tolerance.



Mark is played by **Philip de Grouchy**- A member of the Society since the early 1970s, Philip has played a large variety of parts in every kind of show and was last seen playing Leonato in *Much Ado About Nothing*. Philip was also in our last show at the Studio, *Quartet*, just before first lockdown.

Director's Notes - Sharks in the Custard

I've been umming and ahhing about directing a show for many years and I'm really pleased that I've finally taken the plunge. I have directed before but this is my first time with the Maskers and I wanted to do a comedy for my debut, a short, simple-to-stage comedy suitable for our studio...

So, I trawled the Internet and came up with a few possibilities - and this was the best one, I thought. It's got lovely, funny dialogue, it has depth as well, the characters are nicely drawn and it's only forty minutes long - what could possibly go wrong??

I've been very lucky to have a great cast and crew to work with, who have made rehearsals a lot of fun, and I'm hugely indebted to my mentor and production manager, Meri Mackney, who has been an absolute rock and who has nudged me (and sometimes dragged me!) in the right direction.





Directed by Jez Minns - Jez is not a complete newcomer to directing. In his younger days he directed some adventurous, large-cast shows for an amateur company in Warwickshire. However, this is his first time with Maskers and he has been amazed by the professionalism and expertise of everyone involved. Normally an actor, Jez was last seen in *Much Ado About Nothing* at Townhill Park , playing Borachio, and, in the Studio, in the Maskers' Christmas show, *The Flint Street Nativity*, in which he played the seven-year-old bullyboy, Bradley Jerrams.

Although having performed in over 25 productions with both RAODS and EOMS since rekindling her love of acting in 2012, playing the part of Mair in *Sharks in the Custard* is the first time that Jane has had to master a Welsh accent: an interesting challenge but the perfect opportunity to binge watch Gavin and Stacey!



Bridget is played by Kate Grundy-Garcia - Kate has been a Masker for many years now and has more recently been in *Antigone* and *Comfort Me with Apples*, also performed at the studio. She looks forward to playing a small but compact role this time in *Sharks in the Custard*.
