



Director's Notes

I was an avid watcher of the BBC's Play for Today and vividly remember seeing this piece for the first time in 1979. Of all the plays broadcast, this is the only one I really recall; it must have struck a note. I'd never really seen adults playing the parts of children in this way (other than Laurel & Hardy in 'Brats'); it just blew me away. Ever since, I have wanted to be involved in putting it on. I haven't had the chance to be in it, but Maskers have given me the opportunity to direct it.

On the face of it, it is a nice story about a bunch of seven-year-olds playing in the woods in the Forest of Dean on a summer's afternoon in 1943, but, of course, that's not the whole story. They charge around in the trees playing games, laughing and fighting but also forming alliances, vying for power, bullying and manipulating. It illustrates the power struggles reflective of the adult world, highlighting the impact of social hierarchy on individuals from an early age.

The story then is at times funny, sad and disturbing and all happens in little more than an hour, a roller coaster of emotions. Of course, one of the main talking points of the play is the casting of adults as children. Potter did say that he had an aversion to child actors, or at least their parents! However, this deliberate choice adds depth and complexity to the characters; the actors' adult voices and physicality contrast with the innocence of their characters. This juxtaposition serves as a constant reminder that despite the carefree nature of childhood, the seeds of adult behaviour and emotion are already present.

Potter wanted the children's behaviour to really be analysed. Using adults means the audience will concentrate on what they are doing and, arguably, adults portray emotion better than children. In an example, Willie's behaviour is childish with him using his hands as aeroplane wings and making sounds like an aeroplane. If you saw a child do this then it would be normal, but seeing an adult potentially makes you watch the movement more closely.


Watching the cast relishing the opportunity to behave like kids has been fun, and maybe slightly worrying. In the end though, *Blue Remembered Hills* is a masterful piece of storytelling from a master of his art and I hope that this production does justice to it.

The Cast



John played by Duncan Randall — Duncan is involved in various community theatre groups. On moving to the South coast, he joined Titchfield Festival Theatre (TFT), creating roles such as, Bri in A Day in the Death of Joe Egg, Enobarbus (Anthony and Cleopatra), Goldberg (The Birthday Party) and the Landlord in Jim Cartwright's Two. Duncan joined the Maskers 2022 playing Athos in The Three Musketeers. Since then, he has appeared in The Picture of Dorian Gray, Gormenghast, Time and Tide, Blithe Spirit, Murder in the Studio and Romeo and Juliet. As a children's nurse, teaching children's nursing for the past 25 odd years, Duncan has no trouble acting like a big kid. Playing John has been a delight reconnecting with those days wandering Horsell Common, discovering WW2 unexploded bombs!



Peter played by **Iain Shaw** — Iain Shaw is a new addition to Maskers. He first started acting in his hometown of Romsey when, at the age of 15, he appeared in RAODS production of the environmental-themed play, *The Dream Factory*. In Southampton he worked with the Blag It theatre company on several adult pantos and plays. In recent years Iain has written, directed, produced and starred in several audio dramas for charity, raising thousands of pounds. He's also a keen podcaster and event host. He lives with his dog Willow.



Willie played by Paul Baker — Paul joined Maskers in 1996 and since then has been in over twenty-five shows in the open-air for Maskers. He has played a variety of roles including: Weasel Norman in *The Wind in the Willows*, Thomas Cromwell in *Anne Boleyn* and often multiple parts in the same production as evidenced when he played four different characters in *The Three Musketeers*. Paul has appeared in most of the recent productions in Maskers Studio, having played, Sepulchrave in *Gormenghast* and Chris Kriegle, the Santa Burglar, in *Sorry! Wrong Chimney!*, Uncle George in *Cash on Delivery*, three different characters in *Murder in the Studio* and, most recently, the Auditor in *Murder in the Citizens' Jury*. He is enjoying channelling his inner child as Willie



Raymond played by William Baggs — William's character, Raymond, is John's stuttering brother. William has played numerous characters for Maskers including King James in *Anne Boleyn* and Richard in *Richard II*, Lysander in *A Midsummer Night's Dream* and Shere Kahn in *The Jungle Book*. William also directs and enjoyed directing the open-air production of *The Three Musketeers*. He is a massive Dennis Potter fan so being in this production is a huge thrill!



Angela played by Marie McDade — Marie joined the Maskers in 2011 and has enjoyed a wide range of roles in both the studio and outdoor productions. These have included: The Jungle Book, Around the World in 80 Days, Wyrd Sisters, A Bunch of Amateurs, Much Ado About Nothing, The Three Musketeers, Out of Focus, Gormenghast, Sorry! Wrong Chimney and, most recently, Cash on Delivery.



Audrey played by **Emma Kirkpatrick** — Emma has been with Maskers since 2021 and made her debut performance in *Out of Focus*.
