Unbelievably it is over ten years since Michael Green's classic "The Art of Coarse Acting" was published. And when the idea of this Festival was first discussed less than ten months ago, all three of us directly concerned said: "Oh yes. I have a copy of course." And all three of us sheepishly admitted a day or two later that ours could not be found. The result, no doubt, of the exercise of The Art of Coarse Lending.

The book covers the whole field of theatre - indeed it is sub-titled "How to Wreck an Amateur Dramatic Society". In this Festival we have restricted ourselves to the stage itself. Competing teams have been given a list of subjects from which to choose one and are allowed 9 to 12 minutes, and from 2 to 7 performers with which to complete their task. But above all they have been asked to enjoy themselves and to entertain you, the audience. If any team has taken itself seriously it has broken Law One of Coarse Festivals.

The Salisbury Playhouse is grateful to the three Heat organisers who have been responsible for making all the arrangements for this preliminary round in Salisbury, Southampton and Weymouth, to those who have made premises available, and to those Amateur Companies who have entered. The winning team from each heat will go forward to a Grand Final in the Salisbury Playhouse on Sunday 23rd March, where they will compete against invited teams from The Questors, Bristol Old Vic and the National Theatre, and against the Playhouse itself. Michael Green himself will be adjudicating, in not too serious a vein. A night not to be missed so why not get your tickets here in the Interval or after the show? They are only 40p each.

Quote from one of the first enquiries about the Festival: "I have always considered myself to be a fine Coarse Actor and welcome the opportunity to prove it".
