Mark's association with the Maskers Theatre Company began in 1992, when he was cast as Mozart in Philippa Taylor's production of *Amadeus*. He played opposite Karen Upfield, with whom he has since toured extensively as a member of her theatre company, *Merlin*. In October 1993, he joined the cast of 'A Small Family Business' at the Theatre Royal, Winchester, at very short notice, wearing a series of wigs originally made for Bobby Davro. January 1994 saw him playing Feste in *Twelfth Night* at the Nuffield, in which he was upstaged nightly by a piece of chiffon. Similar pieces of chiffon may still be purchased for 99p at Etam.

Since graduating from King Alfred's College in 1981, Mark has undertaken a variety of jobs. One of these consisted of a 1½ year stint at the D.H.S.S. (working there), where he met Kerry Connolly, who has consistently bemoaned the fact that neither she nor the D.H.S.S. have ever appeared in his programme notes. Kerry now manages Southampton's Tourist Information Centre, and will be happy to advise you as to the relocation of the Post Office. But let's get back to Mark, shall we? He has taught Drama; spent 5 years as an Actor/Musician all over England (well not all over it); and will willingly advise you where not to stay in Derby.

Although he has now "retired" from professional performance, putting the future of British theatre first, he continues to write music and lyrics at the drop of a feathered chapeau (several of his more scurrilous couplets were heard in the 1992 D'Oyly Carte Production of *The Mikado*, which was subsequently shown on BBC 2). He is now happy to be working full time at the Mayflower Theatre and would like you to know that the summer show *Sweet Lorraine*, is a damn good night out. Current pursuits include more work with Maskers, and sorting out a mortgage.

Kirsty graduated from the London College of Music in 1992, and was a Post Graduate at Trinity College in 1993.
