It is influenced by Pinter's involvement with Amnesty International but he deliberately avoids identifying his characters with any particular country That after all, eis the point: in an interview on the play and its politics Pinter Says "There are at least 90 countries that practice torture as an accepted routine. It is only too easy to ignore the horror of what's going on around us, The facts this play refers to are facts I wish the audience to know about to recognise."
