

Mrs Vealfoy, the sharp-suited, smiling face of Personnel, keeps a file on all employees, including a young typist named Debbie – recently put in the family way by a young man who she met by accident and who 'seemed to know what he was up to'. Ray likes an easy life – music, sex, the Arts – but the time may have come for him to consider his future.
