

Ramblings of the Director

Welcome aboard! I hope you landlubbers find your sea legs and enjoy the adventure.

As is often the case with theatre, the idea that sparks the journey is often a passing one, which then niggles away at the back of your mind until it eventually nurtures itself into something that cannot be ignored. A couple of years ago whilst involved in another production here, a couple of things struck me. One of which was that the terraced area in front of you looked similar to the tiered deck of an



18th century sailing ship. That linked with a desire to produce a theatrical spectacle and the search was then on for a suitable script about pirates. And after reading many, I was finally lucky enough to be pointed in the direction of Ken Ludwig's excellent adaptation of the classic tale Treasure Island. As it was only published in 2008 I was delighted to find a script that is modern and fresh in its approach to this well know tale. Personally I think he has skillfully retained the sense of adventure, familiarity, danger and romance that we have come to expect from a pirate story, whilst injecting a pace, vibrancy and dare I say cinematic quality that a post modern audience comes to expect whether we realize it or not.

Much of what we think we know about pirates is born from a romantic fictionalization. Most famously, what has perhaps pervaded our notion of what a pirate is, or more to the point sounds like, is the Walt Disney Film of Treasure Island. Robert Newton was cast in the role of Long John Silver and he is often accredited / accused of inventing the stereotypical pirate voice by virtue of exaggerating his native west country accent. This is also where the commonly used "arringh matey" comes from. Although I am sure that there were west country pirates, in reality those who were involved in this dangerous lifestyle were from all over the world and social 'classes'.

In truth the origin of everything we think we know about pirates was in the publisher Charles Rivington's shop near St Paul's Cathedral. In May 1724 a new book appeared on the shelves next to the more traditional finely bound religious works. With its simple plain leather binding it would have passed unnoticed had it not been for its arresting title, 'A General History of the Robberies and Murders of the most notorious Pyrates'. Its author was Captain Charles Johnson and he gave a vivid and bloodthirsty account of a dozen English and Welsh pirates who had recently been in the news. Many of which he knew and had sailed with. This book took the lid off a shocking world of crime on the high seas and had all the ingredients of a best seller. And to this day it is arguably the truest description of what became know as the Golden age of Piracy. It has been re-published many times throughout the years and is still available and makes for an informative read for anyone with an interest in the subject. Robert Louis Stevenson openly accredited this book for heavily influencing his creation of Treasure Island.

But we a have come a long way since Stevenson's literary creation and, therefore, I wanted to explore a slightly less stereotypical depiction of the pirate world, whilst still retaining a firm anchor in what we think we know to be true. In this production I have explored the notion of fantasy and an openly theatrical world of Treasure Island. If you need a hook to hang your cutlass on then look no further than the films TimeBandits and Madmax, or the theatrical adaptation of His Dark Materials. Alluding to the quirky and eccentric cinematic styles of Terry Gilliam and Tim Burton, it was fully my intention that this show have elements that are incongruous with the historical timeframe in which it is set. In researching the style I wanted, I discovered a sub culture of cyber punk that grew up in the 1990's called SteamPunk. Although it is actually based around the Victorian era its core value fitted well to what I was searching for. It seeks to find a way to combine the past and the future in an aesthetically

pleasing vet punkish way. It's living a life that looks old fashioned vet speaks to the future. It's taking the detritus of our modern society and incorporating it into a different era. I took the SteamPunk look and let it influence our own PiratePunk style. This led naturally into a personal view that theatre can be made from using 'found' things, stuff we might throw away, as long as you inspire the imagination.

So lay back in you hammock, enjoy a hearty swig of rum and let the weird and wonderful waves that lap at the shore of our island whisk you off on a crazy adventure.




