Amy Rosenthal is a London-based British playwright. She is the daughter of Jack Rosenthal and Maureen Lipman and writes with the same sense of humour as her father. 'Sitting Pretty' was Amy's first full-length play, and premiered at the Chelsea Centre in London in December 1999. 



Jenni Watson is playing Nancy, a 55 five year old woman who has recently been made redundant. Jenni has been with Maskers for many years and started her acting career at the age of 3! Her acting challenges continued throughout her school life and drama school. This is the first time, however, that she has been required to appear nude on stage - well almost nude!!

Jan Spiers is playing Nina. This is Jan's third performance at the Nuffield with Maskers. She played Mrs Cheveley in 'An Ideal Husband' and Flora in 'Humble Boy'. With other previous performances for Maskers in 'Manin-the-moon Marigolds', 'Our Lady of Sligo', and 'Ladies Day'. She is excited about this production and would like to thank her sister Jackie for encouraging her to audition for the role of Nina.





David Collis is playing Max the ever attentive, kindly friend of Nancy and Nina. Convinced he is in love with Nina, his calm, if slightly confused, guidance of the ladies leads him to a surprising (for him) conclusion. David started in amateur theatre in 1994. He loves performing at the Nuffield and this will be his 10th time on this stage, fourth time with Maskers.

Nay Walton plays Zelda, a sassy 20 year old. Having been out of the acting scene for over 5 years she is thrilled to be making her debut for the Maskers in 'Sitting Pretty' with such a fantastically strong cast and director. Previous roles during school included Dora Spenlow in 'David Copperfield', Johanna in 'Sweeney Todd' and Honey in 'Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf?'





William Baggs is playing Philip, an artist. Sitting Pretty is Williams's fourth production for Maskers since joining 18 months ago. He's played a mouse, a lover, a king and now Philip. Sitting Pretty is a comedy with much light and shade - well he would asy that wouldn't he, playing the artist. This is William's first time on the Nuffield stage which he says is both exciting and a little nerve wracking all at the same time.

Robert Osborne is playing Luka. Having renewed his interest in theatre while studying at the University of Southampton, Robert joined Maskers in 2011. He has since acted in 'Ghostly Tales' and worked backstage on several productions, most recently stage managing 'Butterfly Kiss'. This is his first time on the Nuffield stage and he is thrilled to be appearing in Sitting Pretty.





Jo Fox is playing Josie, a brittle and elegant art class student. Jo has been a Masker since 2007. She has appeared in 'An Ideal Husband', 'Whale Music' and 'Comedy of Errors'. After taking a break from the acting side of Maskers due to living in London she returned to Southampton and played Lady Jane Rochford, in 'Anne Boleyn' at Hamptworth Lodge last year.

Sue Dashper, is playing the wife of Martin, Bridget. Sue has been involved in theatre and drama for many years. In recent years she has appeared in Maskers' productions including playing the Human Resources Manager from hell in 'Contractions' and a countryperson in 'Anne Boleyn'. This is Sue's first appearance at the Nuffield Theatre for the Maskers.





Avril Woodward is playing Sylvia. Avril is a long-time member of Maskers. She has appeared in many productions in many venues, the last Maskers' production at the Nuffield she acted in was 'Uncle Vanya'. Avril is looking forward to portraying somecne who is described by the script as being "stately".

Marcus Kinsella is playing Martin, a tetchy, nerdy and uptight character who's basically fed up with his lot! He begrudgingly attends Art classes with his long suffering wife Bridget.
